Sentence:

A sentence is 'a group of words' which expresses a complete sense or thought.

Types of Sentences:

- 1. Declarative or Assertive Sentences (Affirmative as well as Negative)
- 2. Exclamatory Sentences
- 3. Imperative Sentences
- 4. Interrogative Sentences

1. Declarative or Assertive Sentences:

This type of sentence expresses an opinion or makes a statement (Affirmative as well as Negative). It ends with a full stop.

Examples:

- The old man failed to cross the river.
- He is not a brave boy.
- The sun shines bright.

2. Exclamatory Sentences:

An exclamatory sentence expresses deep emotions or strong feelings. It can either be disbelief or happiness. It ends with an exclamation mark (!).

Examples:

- What a lovely flower!
- I can't believe how fast that car was moving!
- Alas! The dog is dead.

3.Imperative Sentences:

An Imperative sentence expresses a command, request, demand, or an order or instruction. A full stop comes in the end, but in some cases sign of exclamation is also used. This can either be negative or positive depending on a message.

Examples:

- 1. Do not stop!
- 2. Never speak to me like that again.
- 3. Please leave your shoes outside.

4. Interrogative Sentences

An Interrogative Sentence asks a question. It ends with a question mark (?).

Examples:

- What are you doing?
- Where do you live?
- How often do you read this article?
