

A Doll's House was published on December 4, 1879 and first performed on December 21, 1879 in A Doll's House. Henrik Ibsen portrays the roles of men and women and how they must act, and look based on society's standards. A Doll's House is also a play of social criticism in the sense that it has criticized the traditional marriage, man-woman relationship and the domination of the female by the male in name of family. Ibsen has taken up the problems of marriage as an issue for this problem work, and he has exposed a number of problems inside the mask of outwardly perfect relations between a husband and wife. Ibsen is known as the "father of modern drama" because he elevated theater from entertainment to a forum for expressing social problems.
