Interrogative sentences.

There are two types of interrogative sentences.

- 1. Sentences which start with helping verbs.
- 2. Sentences which start with WH family

RULES TO CHANGE INTO INDIRECT FORM

If the sentence starts with the helping verb, we are to use ' if ' as a conjunction between reporting verb and reported speech, and change it into a simple sentence. General rules of tenses and pronounce are to be followed.

Ex.

Type 1 He said to me, ' are you going to the market?' He asked me if I was going to the market.

I said to her, ' do you know the answer?' I asked her if she knew the answer.

Type 2 He said to me," what have you done?" He asked me what I had done.

I said to him," where are you going? I asked him where he was going.

RULE : when the sentence starts with the wh family words no other conjunction is used to remove the inverted commas.
