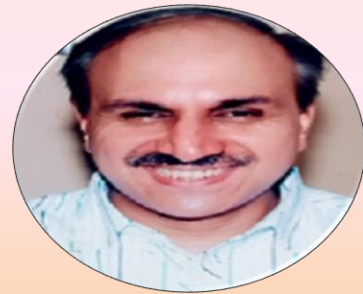

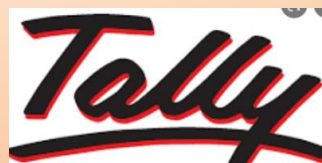
Mega Placement

Under Graduate Courses

B.A. (Pass Course) & B.A. English (Hons.)

In this programme, the students are required to take compulsory and elective subjects (as listed below).

Minimum Eligibility Conditions

- Pass in Senior Secondary Examination (10+2) of Board of School Education, Haryana with English as a subject or any other Examination recognised as equivalent thereto by Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra
- For admission in B.A. minimum marks in qualifying examination is 35%. And for admission in B.A. Eng (Hons.) minimum marks in qualifying examination is 50%.
- Admission will be granted strictly on merit basis (presently online mode of preparing the merit list), as per the instructions issued by Department of Higher Education Haryana and Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra.

Duration of the Course: 3 Years (6 Semesters)

B.Com.

Minimum Eligibility Conditions

- 1) Pass in Senior Secondary Examination (10+2) of Board of School Education, Haryana with
- 2) For admission in B.Com.-1st, minimum 40% marks in aggregate with commerce stream and minimum 50% marks in aggregate with Arts & Science stream are required.
- 3) Admission will be granted strictly on merit basis (presently online mode of preparing the merit list), as per the instructions issued by Department of Higher Education Haryana and Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra.

Duration of the Course: 3 Years (6 Semesters)

B.Com (Hons.)

Minimum Eligibility Conditions

- 1) Pass in Senior Secondary Examination (10+2) of Board of School Education, Haryana with English as a subject or any other examination recognised as equivalent thereto by Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra.
- 2) For admission in B.Com-I minimum of 40% marks in aggregate with commerce stream and minimum of 50% marks in aggregate with Arts & Science stream are required.
- 3) Admission will be granted strictly on merit basis (presently online mode of preparing the merit list), as per the instructions issued by Department of Higher Education Haryana and Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra.

Duration of the Course: 3 Years (6 Semesters)

B.Sc. Physical Science (Computer Science)

The college provides the B.Sc. programme in the Semester mode in core stream of Computer Science.

Minimum Eligibility Condition for Admission

- 1) Pass in Senior Secondary Examination (10+2 Science Stream) Board of School Education, Haryana with English as a subject or any other Examination recognised as equivalent thereto
- 2) For admission in B.Sc.-I minimum marks in qualifying examination is 40%
- 3) Admission will be granted strictly on merit basis (presently online mode of preparing the merit list), as per the instructions issued by Department of Higher Education Haryana and Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra.

Duration of the Course : 3 Years (6 Semesters)

B.Sc. Physical Science (Non-Medical); B.Sc. Life Science (Medical & Biotechnology)

Minimum Eligibility Condition

1. Pass in Senior Secondary Examination (10+2 Science Stream) from Board of School Education, Haryana with English as a subject or any other Examination recognised as equivalent thereto by Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra.
2. For admission in B.Sc.-1st, minimum 40% marks are required in qualifying examination i.e.10+2.
3. Admission will be granted strictly on merit basis (presently online mode of preparing the merit list), as per the instructions issued by Department of Higher Education Haryana and Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra.

Duration of the Course: 3 Years (6 Semesters)

Post Graduate Courses

From the session (2024-25), PG courses will be run as per the guidelines of NEP-2020.

M.A. English

Minimum Eligibility Conditions

Passing one of the following examinations of KUK, or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto:

- 1.B.A. with English as one of the subjects securing at least 50% marks in aggregate OR at least 45% marks in English subject in aggregate of all the three years
- 2.B.A. (Hons.) English examination with minimum 45% marks in aggregate.
3. Any other examination recognised for admission to M.A. (English) courses with at least 50% marks in aggregate.

Duration of the Course 2 years (4 Semesters)

M.A. Hindi

Minimum Eligibility Conditions

1. Graduation with Hindi as a subject for minimum year of study, securing at least 50% marks in aggregate OR at least 45% marks in the subject of Hindi in aggregate.
2. Any other examination recognised by KUK, for admission to M.A. (Hindi) courses with at least 50% marks in aggregate.

Duration of the Course: 2 years (4 Semesters)

M.Sc. Mathematics

Minimum Eligibility Conditions

Passing one of the following examinations of KUK, or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto:

1. B.A. (Hons.)/B.Sc. (Hons.) in Mathematics with at least 50% marks in Mathematics OR
2. B.A./B.Sc. (with Mathematics as a subject) obtaining at least 55% marks in aggregate.

Duration of the Course: 2 years (4 Semesters)

M.Com.

Minimum Eligibility Conditions

Minimum 45% marks in aggregate in B.Com./B.B.A. or B.A./B.Sc. with Economics or Mathematics examination of KUK, or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto, with English as one of the subjects.

Duration of the Course: 2 years (4 Semesters)

[M.A. Political Science](#)

Minimum Eligibility Conditions

Passing one of the following examinations of KUK, or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto:

- 1.B.A. (Hons.) in Political Science with at least 45% marks in aggregate. OR
- 2.Graduation with any discipline with at least 50% marks in aggregate OR at least 45% marks in the subject of Political Sc./ Public/ Administration/ Sociology/ History/ Economics.

Duration of the Course: 2 years (4 Semesters)

Minimum Eligibility Conditions

Passing one of the following examinations of KUK, or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto:

- 1.B.A. (Hons.) in History with at least 45% marks in aggregate. OR
- 2.Graduation with any discipline with at least 50% marks in aggregate OR at least 45% marks in the subject of History/ Public/ Administration/ Sociology/ Political Science/ Geography.

Duration of the Course: 2 years (4 Semesters)

Professional Courses

B.C.A.

Minimum Eligibility Conditions

- 1) A student who has passed any one of the following examinations with English as one of the subjects shall be eligible to join BCA Part-I.
- 2) Senior Secondary Certificate Examination (10+2 Standard) of Board of School Education Haryana, Bhiwani or an examination recognised by Kurukshetra University.
- 3) For admission in BCA-I minimum marks in qualifying examination is 50%

Duration of the Course 3 Years (6 Semesters)

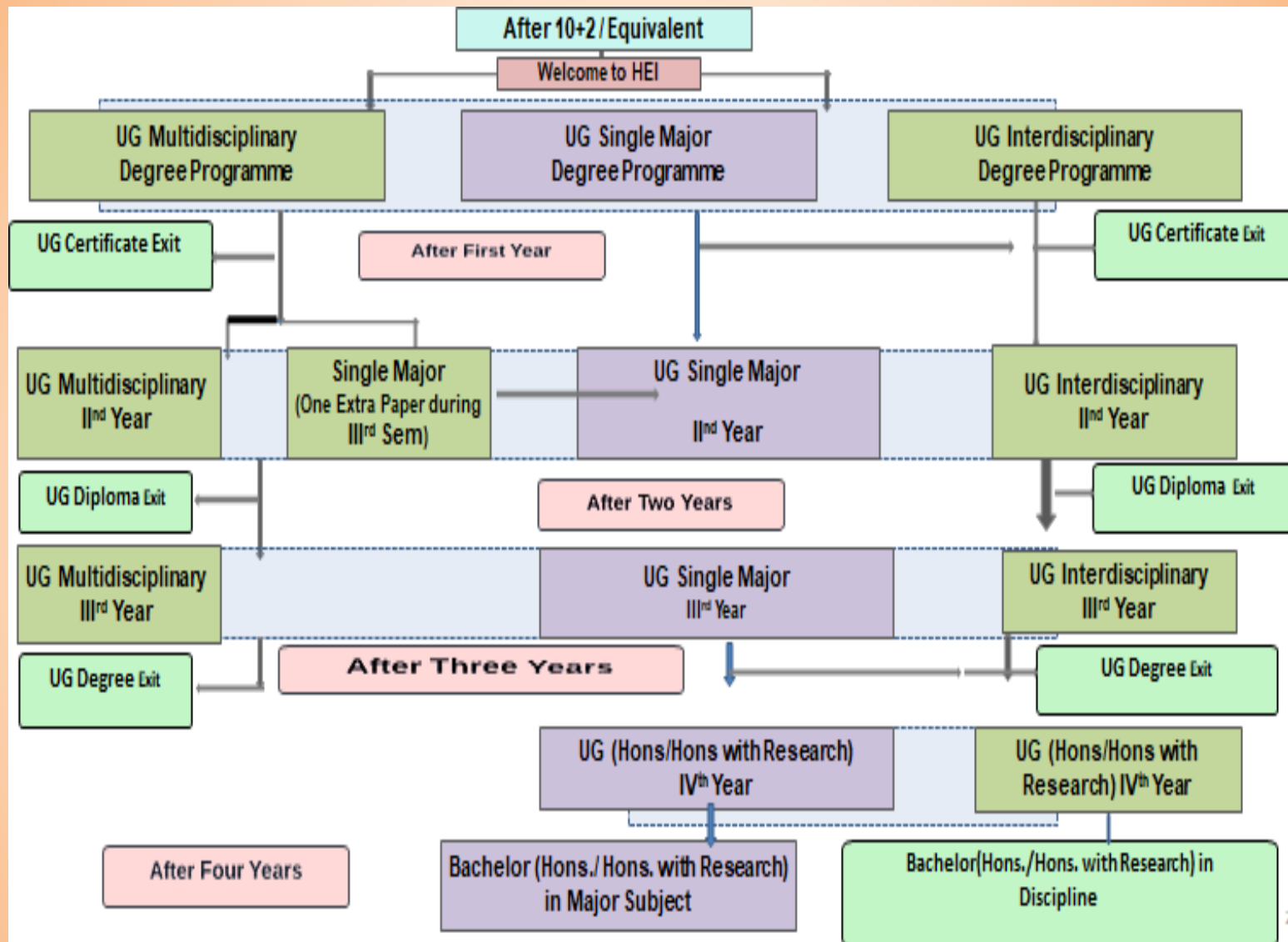

Minimum Eligibility Conditions

- 1) A student who has passed one of the following examinations with English as one of the subjects shall be eligible to join BBA Part-I :
- 2) Senior Secondary Certificate Examination (10+2 standard) of the Board of School
- 3) Education, Haryana, Bhiwani or an examination recognised by Kurukshetra University equivalent thereto with at least 45% marks.
- 4) Admission, even provisional, will not be given to candidates securing compartment in 10+2 examination.
- 5) All other things being equal, preference will be given to the students who have passed 10+2 examination with commerce group and mathematics.

Notes:

- Subjects (Major and Minor), DSE, DSEC, SEC, AEC, MDC and VAC courses will be offered by the Department/ College/ Institute depending upon its available faculty, infrastructure and time table.
- A student will opt for Multidisciplinary Course from the subject which is different from the discipline of major and minor subjects.
- Students are not allowed to choose or repeat courses already undergone at the higher secondary level (12th class) or opted as major and minor discipline under this category. Provided further that if a Multidisciplinary Course across the discipline cannot be offered by the Department/ Institute/College, due to its constraints and available resources, then
 - i. MDC can be opted out of MOOCs through SWAYAM
 - ii. MDC can be completed out of online courses offered by the Kurukshetra University
 - iii. MDC can be completed from a cluster college, i.e., from a neighbouring college/institute
- A student will opt for AEC, SEC, VAC and Minor(Vocational) courses from the respective pools of courses offered by the Department/ College/Institute duly approved by the University. A Department/Institute/College can add more courses in the pools of AEC, SEC, VAC and Vocational courses with prior approval of the university.

- For first and second semester of UG programme (Multidisciplinary) (Scheme A and B), a student can choose a Minor Course of 2 credit from the pool of minor subjects in that semester offered by the Department/Institute/College.
- For first and second semester of UG programme with Single Major (Scheme C), a student can choose a Minor Course of 4 credit, say Subject E, out of available Core Courses of that subject E offered in that semester.
- From 3rd semester onwards of all three schemes, a student can choose a Minor Course, say Subject E, out of available Core Courses of that subject E offered in that semester.
- In the subjects/courses which involve practicum, i.e. Practical/ Laboratory/ Studio/ Project/ Survey/Field work, etc., a course of 4 credits will dedicate 3 credits for lectures and one credit for practicum and in other subjects/courses not having practicum component, a course of 4 credits will dedicate 3 credits for lectures and 1 credit for tutorial. During 4th year, when the practicum course is offered as a separate course in that subject, then a course of 4 credits will dedicate 3 credits for lectures and 1 credit for tutorial. However, for any DSE course, a course of 4 credits will dedicate 3 credits for lectures and one credit for tutorial.
- In case of AEC of 2 credits, the entire 2 credits will be dedicated for lectures.
- In the SEC courses of 3 credits, 2 credits will be dedicated for lectures and 1 credit for practicum, In the SEC courses of 2 credits, 1 credits will be dedicated for lecture and 1 credit for practicum and in the DSEC courses of 4 credits, 3 credits will be dedicated for lectures and 1 credit for practicum.
- If a student takes exit after the second semester, then Undergraduate Certificate in Discipline/subject will be awarded after earning 52/48 credits including 4 credits for the internship of 4-6 weeks during the summer vacation. The nomenclature of the Discipline will depend upon the subjects opted during the programme. For example, if a student has studied two subjects Physics and Chemistry or Physics and Mathematics or Chemistry and Zoology, the Undergraduate Certificate in Physical Science and Life Science respectively will be awarded. Similarly, if a student has studied two subjects Economics and Sociology or Economics and Mathematics or Political Science and Hindi, the Undergraduate Certificate in Arts will be awarded.
- If a student takes exit after the 4th semester, then Undergraduate Diploma in Discipline will be awarded after earning 96 credits (Scheme A and Scheme D) including 4 credits for the internship of 4-6 weeks during the summer vacation. In case, a student takes exit after 2nd year of UG Programme with Single Major, then Undergraduate Diploma in Major Subject will be awarded after 100 credits (Scheme B) and 94 credits (Scheme C) including 4 credits for the internship of 4-6 weeks during the summer vacation.

➤ MDC can be opted out of MOOCs through SWAYAM

➤ MDC can be completed out of online courses offered by the Kurukshetra University

➤ MDC can be completed from a cluster college, i.e., from a neighboring college/institute

➤ A student will opt for AEC, SEC, VAC and Minor(Vocational) courses from the respective pools of courses offered by the Department/College/Institute duly approved by the University. A Department/Institute/College can add more courses in the pools of AEC, SEC, VAC and Vocational courses with prior approval of the university.

➤ For first and second semester of UG programme (Interdisciplinary) (Scheme D), a student can choose a Minor Course of 2 credit from the pool of minor subjects in that semester offered by the Department/Institute/College.

➤ From 3rd semester onwards of the scheme D, a student can choose a Minor Course, say Subject E, out of available Core Courses of that subject E offered in that semester.

➤ In the subjects/courses which involve practicum, i.e. Practical/ Laboratory/ Studio/ Project/ Survey/Field work, etc., a course of 4 credits will dedicate 3 credits for lectures and one credit for practicum and in other subjects/courses, a course of 4 credits will dedicate 3 credits for lectures and 1 credit for tutorial. During 4th year, when the practicum course is offered as a separate course in that subject, then a course of 4 credits will dedicate 3 credits for lectures and 1 credit for tutorial. However, for any DSE course, a course of 4 credits will dedicate 3 credits for lectures and one credit for tutorial.

➤ In case of AEC of 2 credits, the entire 2 credits will be dedicated for lectures.

➤ In the SEC courses of 3 credits, 2 credits will be dedicated for lectures and 1 credit for practicum and in the DSEC courses of 4 credits, 3 credits will be dedicated for lectures and 1 credit for practicum.

➤ If a student takes exit after the second semester, then Undergraduate Certificate in Discipline will be awarded after earning 52 credits including 4 credits for the internship of 4-6 weeks during the summer vacation.

➤ If a student takes exit after the 4th semester, then Undergraduate Diploma in Discipline will be awarded after earning 96 credits including 4 credits for the internship of 4-6 weeks during the summer vacation.

Flexibility/mobility to students

➤ **UG Certificate:** Students who opt to exit after completion of the first year and have secured 48 credits (44 credits in case of single major) will be awarded a UG certificate if, in addition, they complete one internship of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the first year. The students are allowed to re-enter the degree program within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

➤ **UG Diploma:** Students who opt to exit after completion of the 2nd year and have secured 96 credits (94 credits in case of single major) will be awarded the UG diploma if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the second year. These students are allowed to re-enter within period of three years and complete the degree programme within the maximum period of seven years.

➤ **3 Year UG Degree:** Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG programme will be awarded UG Degree in the discipline/subject after successful completion of three years, securing 132 credits (136 credits in case of single major) and satisfying the minimum credit requirements.

Women Cell

STUDENT'S CORNER

GENERAL GUIDELINES

The college campus is a place of enhancing knowledge and enriching your lives with new thoughts and vision. We take utmost care to help you, support you and guide you for different examinations and tough situations. If you are able to inculcate the directives provided by your teachers, you will be comfortable not only in the campus but also off the campus. Following guidelines may assist you to have a beautiful stay in the college during your entire tenure:

Being a co-educational institution, it is our joint responsibility to respect both the genders and give them equal opportunities to participate in all the campus activities.

There is a separate girls wing, where boys are not permitted to enter, except the ones who have their classes in that wing. In cafeteria as well as in library, separate seating arrangements exist for boys and girls. Keeping this in view, all the students are expected to use the assigned places only.

The fees and other dues are charged as per directions from Haryana Govt./KUK, and changes can occur in the existing fee structure, if directions are received from Haryana Govt./KUK. Every student must obtain a receipt without fail, after making any payment to the college. Important instructions received from the University or Haryana Government are circulated on notice boards as well as college website. You are required to be well aware of important cut off dates, the college may not be able to remind individual students about any such lapse on his/her part.

Every student must provide an active contact number to the college for receiving messages, college will not be responsible for non-delivery of any important update.

The fees once paid cannot be refunded. Any delay in deposition of fee by the student will result in imposing of applicable fine. The students failing to deposit the fees will be removed from the college rolls.

GENERAL GUIDELINES (CONTD..)

The students missing the theory and practical classes will be fined as per rules of University. If any student is absent from his/her classes continuously for 14 days, without intimation and prior permission, the name will be struck off and the student has to take re-admission. Minimum 75% attendance is mandatory to become eligible for appearing in University Examinations. For students participating in any of the events like NSS, NCC camps, cultural programmes or any other such event, he/she must submit the recommendation signed by the concerned teacher in charge, giving details of the event with dates.

Any change of subjects will be allowed only for a limited period as permissible, in the first semester only. The request can only be considered if seats are available in the requested subject. No change of subjects is allowed after the stipulated time under any circumstances.

Inter-college migration is possible only after prior permission from both the heads of institutions. The permission may be granted or denied based on the circumstantial evidences. The migrating student has to pay requisite funds, as per rules. Migration is not allowed from local colleges.

If, due to any reason, University cancels the admission of any student or does not approve the admission in a particular class, the student and the wards will be responsible. College will not be responsible for any such cancellation and no claims will be entertained.

Students must obtain information about and apply for different scholarships applicable to them from college authorities.

BUS PASS FACILITY

The students who have to commute on public transport are facilitated to have Bus Pass for their travel, as per the directions and regulations of Department of Public Transport, Government of Haryana. Students are required to bring the following documents for Bus Pass Application:

1. Fee Receipt/Identity Card of the College
2. Aadhar Card
3. Two Passport Sized Photographs
4. Any other proof of Residence, if Aadhar Card is not available.
